Dear LRA Colleagues,

As you are likely aware, much has ensued over the last several weeks. Across the United States, federal grants such as the Teacher Quality Partnership (TQP), Supporting Effective Educator Development (SEED), and Teacher and School Leader Incentive Program (TSL) were canceled. As we write this note, many scholars anxiously await to see if federal research funding will be available from the Institute of Education Sciences (IES), National Center for Education Statistics (NCES), National Science Foundation (NSF), and National Institutes of Health (NIH).

Unequivocally, the cancellation of various grant awards directly impacts our institutions. Of equal importance, is the effect that such adverse actions have on the research that many of us do with teachers, students, and the communities we serve.



In an attempt to be responsive to you, the LRA membership, as you grapple with the effects of grant cancellations and the corresponding enactment of policies that have accompanied such cancellations, over the past week, I have worked in close collaboration with several members of LRA's Executive Committee, including Executive Director Nicollette Schmeichel, to meet with with various organizations. These organizations include the International Literacy Association (ILA), Association of Literacy Educators and Researchers (ALER), American Educational Research Association (AERA), and National Academy of Education (NAEd), to name a few.

To say the least, our educational partners across multiple spheres acknowledge that we're in an era of challenging times. However, with challenges come opportunities. And in general, the topics evolving from our conversations with partners have centered on the importance of collaborating across our respective professional organizations to develop plans to: (a) discern membership concerns and impacts of the termination of grant-funding; (b) educate ourselves about the policy initiatives being proposed and enacted that function as a broader context for the cancellation of grant-funding; (c) identify tangible avenues for providing support to professional members of our organizations who have been adversely affected by grant-cancellations and by the enactment of corresponding policies; and (d) proactively educate the general public and policy experts about the importance of (federally) funded literacy scholarship.

We thank you for your patience as we have worked speedily yet conscientiously to ascertain the best course of action in collaboration with professional partners across the field. We will continue to update LRA members as the collaborative work across these groups unfolds.



Black Spinifex

The artwork and design Black Spinifex reflects my Indigenous Australian culture. It features the shapes, patterns and repetition of the Black Spinifex plant, its seeds and rocks that cover our native deserts and bushland. Through stark black and white lines and patterning, this piece shares deep-seated knowledge and cultural meaning to the viewer. The shapes represent various elements of Country and the land and carries with it this meaning across time and space. I digitally designed this artwork for textiles with the aim of creating a sense of vibrancy and movement through something as simple as black and white. In a broader sense, the design signifies reconciliation as it represents white and black people as different but also able to co-exist together.






